Her work reflects on the formation and loss of identity through everyday rituals that often go unnoticed. Her choice of subjects is heavily influenced by her experiences as a woman, mother and perennial migrant. The result is a series of intimate portraits and soothing landscapes that invite us to take pause.

Photography has been Angelica's passion from an early age. She begun studying photography in 1990 in the Center for Visual Arts (CEV) in Madrid. She has undertaken workshops with Chien-Chi Chang (Magnum), Ron Haviv (VII) Allison Morley (ICP) and Tito Herrera (STUDIO at Getty Images). She was lucky to receive mentoring from the late Tim Hetherington (Magnum). Currently she has been selected to take part of the PhotoEspaña Masters in Photography for Photography processionals (Spain).

Trained as a clinical psychologist with a Master's degree in International Relations from John Hopkins University, for the past 20 years Angélica has complemented her photography work with work in the humanitarian development sector with a focus on programmes to support gender and vulnerable populations. Her clients include UN agencies, governments and foundations. She travels often for her work and regularly lives in different locations, including Cambodia, Ecuador and Kenya. These experience give her a unique perspective into the human condition across cultural, religious and social status, as well as unique access to the intimate world of women from every walk of life.
